Dear Aunt Fanny,

I thank you very
much for the precious gift,
you sent me with your sister,

joy Jena as far as it is possible.

You see on the card picture 2 the
university, which is an old edifice,
but there are in the neighbour hood
about six quite modern established

institutions for medicine, physics, chemistry and so on; especially that of Uncle Ernst for zoology has a fine museum, is situated on the slope of a hill and one has fine views from it.

3. is an old tower erected in the 14th century. At that height of it, where I made an arrow (\rightarrow) apes are constructed in order to let run down the rain-water, therefore the men who had to ^{watch} ~~see~~ at the tower were called "Affenwächter."

5. The Paradies is a fine park on the banks of the Saale, the Jenning is a high hill (364 m = 1100 feet).

6. That little church in a little suburb of Jena is called Schillerkirche because Schiller got married there.

7 and 8 are old rests of castles which had stood there.

11. The Bursche is an ancient and famous inn, in front of which students (Burschenschaftler) are sitting. —
